It is fully accepted that good teaching narrows gaps in attainment, but to improve outcomes for learners vulnerable to under achievement we have a personalised provision that is not only linked to aspects of achievement in the classroom, but also to attendance, aspiration and wider experiences. Our small school structure has increased the level of personalisation we can give our students. All PP students are supported by mentor who identifies needs for each individual through discussion with the student, parent and teachers.
