On Monday 9 December, Longfield Academy played host to a number of schools within Leigh Academies Trust to take part in the IET Faraday Challenge. This activity is all about being Engineers for the day, given a choice of a 'problem' to solve. This year's choices were creating a toy for children aged 2-5 which aided their ability to learn new words, or a device which disabled people could use to access everyday activities.



The first Longfield team created a rotating Jellyfish that had letters on it to support children learning new words. Our second Longfield team created a working car that would support people with a visual impairment getting around on a day to day basis.



It was a closely fought competition between Strood Academy, Leigh Academy Rainham, Sir Geoffrey Leigh Academy and Leigh Stationers' Academy with all schools being commended for their creativity and teamwork. The winner this year was the team from Sir Geoffrey Leigh Academy, who developed a design for a trampoline that could be used safely for people who are deaf and have a visual impairment. A huge well done to all participants in this year's Faraday Challenge, all performed exceptionally teams well and came up with inventive solutions for real world problems.
